

BIG BUGS

Cut out shapes from cardboard and stick them on in different **LAYERS** to fill large pieces of paper with 3D portraits of giant bugs.

1 Copy a large version of one of these body shapes onto cardboard.



2 Cut out the shape. Then glue it in the middle of a piece of bright paper.

3 Draw shapes for legs, antennae, wings, eyes and markings onto more cardboard. (Use the ideas on these pages for inspiration.)



4 Cut out all the body parts and stick them onto your picture.



It's easier to paint the cardboard pieces neatly before you stick them down.

Maybe your bug will have **FEARSOME JAWS?**

Scrunch up little pieces of foil into shiny eyes.

Stick newspaper on cardboard. Then cut out wing shapes.



This insect can **STING**.

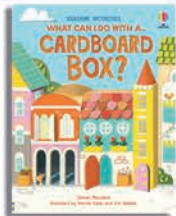
Draw or paint a head, two antennae and six legs like mine directly onto the paper.



Tear corrugated cardboard apart, so you can see its bumpy, rough insides.



Stick **SPOTS** on top of **SPOTS** to create this effect.
