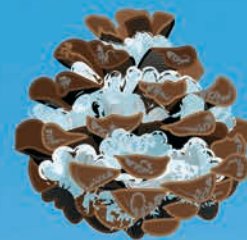
Nocturnal Nature **4+**



Pine cone owls



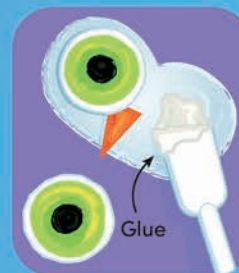
1 Pull apart a few cotton balls. Tuck the pieces into a pine cone.



2 Keep adding pieces until all the gaps are filled.



3 Draw two eyes and a beak on cardboard. Cut them out.



4 Draw a big B-shape on felt. Cut it out. Glue on the beak, then the eyes on top.



5 Cut two wing shapes from felt. For each, add a dab of glue at one end and pinch.



6 Use poster putty to fix the wings and face onto the pine cone.



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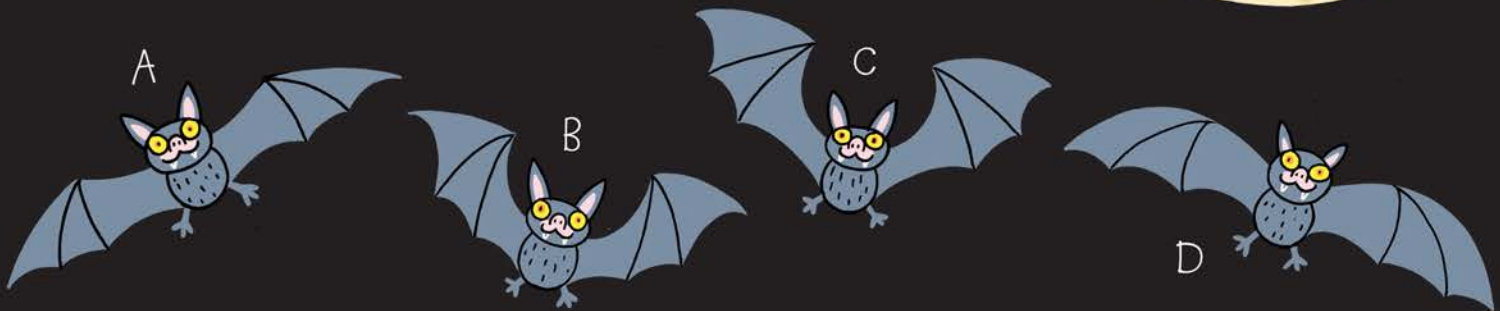
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Nature at night
