I hide among rocks in the sea. Don't step on me, as I have deadly poisonous spines.



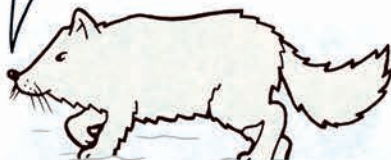
It's hard for a predator to spot me, as I look just like the trees I live on.

I like to sit on leaves, as I look just like one...



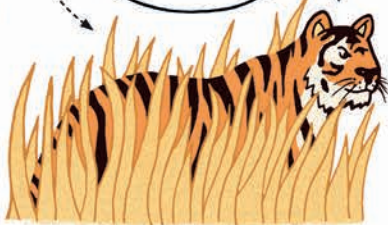
The best way for me to avoid hungry birds is to hide on something hairy.

Only use each letter the number of times that it appears in the word.

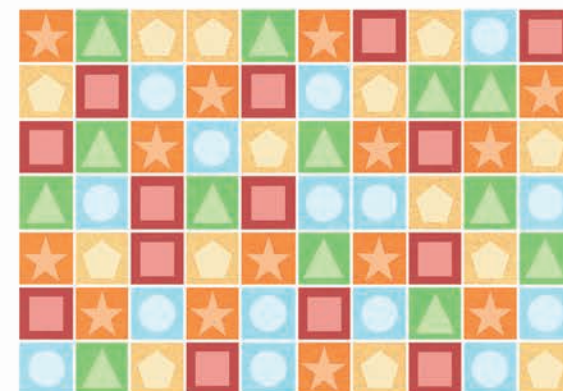

It's not just animals that can hide... See if you can find these groups of shapes hidden in the pattern on the right.

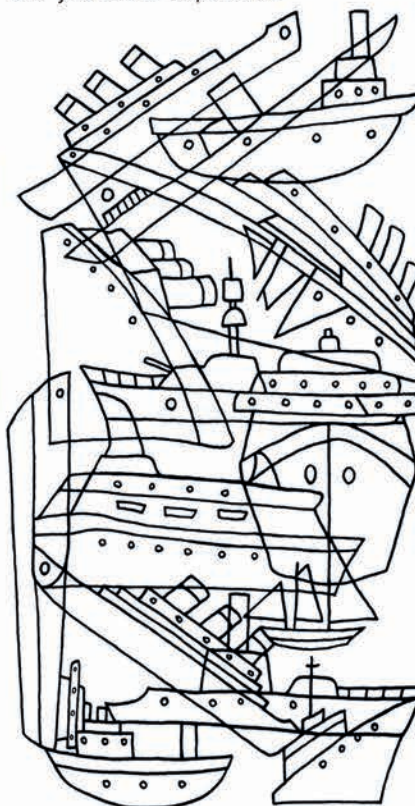


Draw around the groups of shapes when you find them.

## Hidden messages

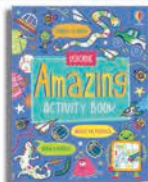
Below is the same message translated into three different codes. Draw a line to connect each coded message with the code that was used.

- Write the alphabet, then write it backwards underneath. A becomes Z, B is Y, and so on...

### The messages...

- EM GATE NE GALBT AK XIST.
- NVVG ZTVMG YOZXP ZG HRC.
- TEEM TGENA KLAGB TA XIS.
