'ch' sounds like the 'sh' in 'shoe'



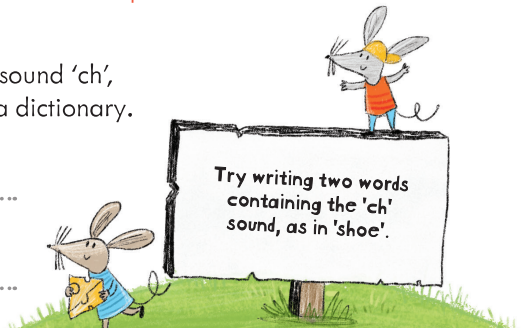

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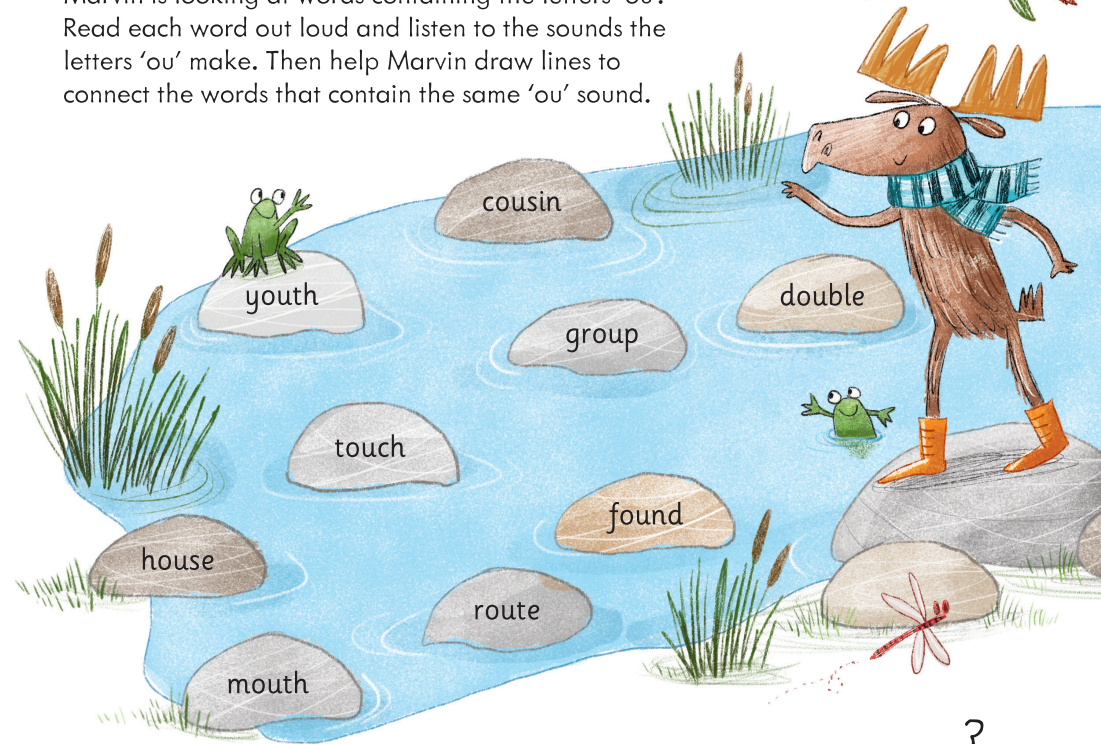
Now write two more words that contain the sound 'ch', as in 'cheese'. You can check your words in a dictionary.

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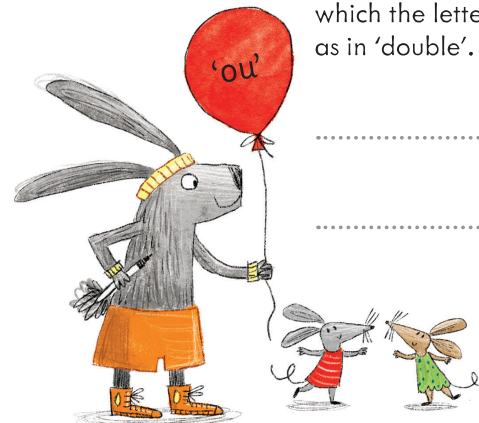
