

# Trees in winter



Draw the tree trunks bending at different angles.



Make the zigzags a triangular shape.



1. Draw a tree trunk with a blue felt-tip pen on a piece of paper. Then, add branches coming from the trunk. Add little twigs on the branches.

2. Draw lots more trees in the same way. Draw large ones at the bottom of the paper and much smaller ones at the top.

3. Draw green zigzag trees in between the other trees. Draw a short line for a trunk at the bottom. Fill in any spaces with purple trees.



4. Add dots for snow across the paper with a white wax crayon – they are shown here in yellow so that you can see them.



5. Draw some hills above the trees with a pencil. Then, mix some watery blue paint. Fill in the hills and paint a shadow beneath each tree.



6. When the hills are dry, mix some darker blue paint and brush it across the sky. Then, leave the painting to dry completely.



7. Dip a clean paintbrush into some water, then brush it around and around on top of one of the trees. The ink will run in the water.



8. Brush water over all the other blue trees. Then, brush water over the green and purple trees, rinsing your brush each time.
