

Painted flowers

Daffodil



1. Pressing hard, use a white wax crayon or oil pastel to draw the middle of a daffodil.



2. Mix watery yellow paint. Then, paint petals over the wax crayon. The wax resists the paint.



3. When the petals are dry, paint a shape for the top of the stalk with green watery paint.



4. Use a thin paintbrush to paint a long stalk. Then, paint a long pointed leaf next to it, like this.

You could paint a bee next to a flower. Draw black stripes. Then, use watery paints for the body and wings.

Tulip



1. Draw tulip petals with a white wax crayon or oil pastel. Add lines on some petals, too.



2. Brush watery red paint over the crayon lines. When the paint is dry, paint a green stalk.



Purple flower



1. Use a white wax crayon or oil pastel to draw a simple flower shape with four petals.



2. Draw lines on the petals. Then, draw the middle of the flower with a yellow crayon.



3. Paint over the petals and middle with watery purple paint. Add a stalk when it's dry.

Bunch of flowers

Draw lots of flowers close together. Paint their petals, then add the stalks when the paint is dry.
