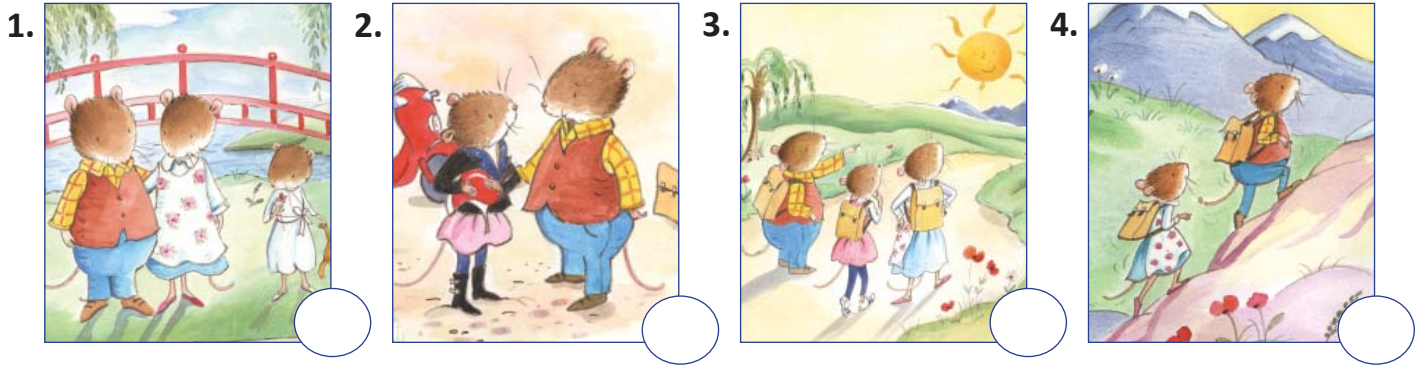


The Mouse's Wedding • Worksheet

2. Match the two halves of the sentence.



- A. They waited until evening, when... ..they came to a high wall.

3. Match the speech bubbles with the correct characters.


