
Ladybirds

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


The Beto cousins are going on a picnic.
SOME have been gathering seeds. How many seeds have they collected between them?



I've collected 32 seeds.

The cousins are standing in a grid. Some of them are missing their spots. Look at the grid and draw spots so that **EACH** row, column and diagonal contains **EXACTLY 15** spots.



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Paper finger-bugs

Have fun flying these bugs around on your finger, indoors or out.



1 Cut a strip of paper the width of a finger.



2 Put glue at the top of the strip.



3 Wrap it loosely around your fingertip...

Two for the wings



4 ...then press the glued end down to make a ring.



5 Draw around the bottom of a cup three times on paper.

One for the body



6 Cut out all three circles and fold the wings in half.



7 Draw details on the body...



8 ...then stick the wings on like this.



9 Push the ring onto the tip of your finger and glue your bug to it.



You could glue on paper strips for feelers.



Add details to the wings if you like.

Caterpillar



1 Make two rings that fit on your finger like this.



2 Cut a strip of paper a little longer than your finger...



3 ...and draw on details.

Trim the ends.




4 Glue one end of your caterpillar to each ring.

Your caterpillar should bend up in the middle.
