Top tips from editor Alex Frith


Here are some top tips from one of the editors of the series to help you:

- The first rule of finding an interesting fact is to test how interesting and surprising it really is. When you think you've got a fact, find someone you trust and ask them 'Did you know...' If they did know the fact, then you'll need to think of something a bit more surprising.
- 2. Once you've found your fact, don't worry about explaining the fact, first think about what picture you think would go with the fact. I think the best thing about the 100 Things to Know series is not just the facts inside them, but the way that they're represented. It can make you think of a new way to think about something that you thought you understood before through seeing it drawn in a picture.


